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Special precautions

Having an autoimmune condition could reduce your resistance to infection. We strongly advise the annual flu vaccine and the 10 yearly pneumonia vaccine.

All infections should be treated promptly. If you are aware of an infection, arrange to see your GP.

Possible side-effects

Nausea, upset stomach

Take the tablets with or after food, if possible in the evening, to reduce any stomach upset. Drink plenty of water with the tablets. The feeling of sickness usually goes away after a time as your body gets used to the treatment. If the sickness is severe, consult
